
Difficulty:

TripleCross - Intermediate Puzzle #59

This puzzle is like a crossword, but with numbers. Each digit occupies a hexagonal cell and can be a part of a "word" in the across, up, and down directions.

Rules:

- 1. "Words" may not start with a zero.
- 2. "Words" in the 'across' direction read from left to right.
- 3. "Words" in the 'up' direction read along the upward diagonal to the right.
- 4. "Words" in the 'down' direction read along the downward diagonal to the right.
- 5. There is one unique solution which satisfies all the clues given below.
- 6. Some "words" may not have clues. They will be determined by the "words" which intersect them.



Across

- 1 Same as 6 down
- 4 8 up minus half of 2 down
- **6** A prime number
- 7 Consecutive digits in descending order 10 Ten times a square
- **8** Six hundred ninety-two less than 8 up
- 10 Nineteen times a square

Up

- **5** 7 across minus 6 across
- **6** Twice the result of 12 up plus 9 down
- **8** Thirty-four times a prime number
- **11** 4 down plus 7 across
- **12** Twice a prime number

Down

- **1** Twice a prime number
- **2** Twice a prime number
- **3** Twice the result of 6 down plus 5 up
- **4** Seven times a square
- **6** Seven times a prime number
- **9** A prime number
